

Ordinance Number 16

An Ordinance relating to Billiard, Pool tables, ECT.

Be it ordained by the City Council:

Section 1 (License for What) No person or persons, firm or corporation shall keep within the City of Washburn a public room, house or place containing any billiard table, pool table, pigeon-hole table, bagatelle table or bowling alley, for the use of the public, without first having obtained a license therefor as hereinafter provided.

Section 2. (License. How obtained. Amount of. Term of.) Any person desiring to obtain such license shall present his written or oral application therefor to the City Council of said city, stating therein the kind of tables or for what such license is applied for, and designating the ~~place~~ place or room in which such tables or alleys is to be kept and upon payment to the city treasurer of the sum of five dollars for each and every billiard table, pool table, pigeon-hole table, bagatelle table and the sum of \$2.50 for each and every bowling alley and ten pin alley so kept as specified in section one of this ordinance, shall receive from said treasurer his receipt therefor, stating the amount paid, for what paid, and designating the place in which said tables or other implements or alleys are to be kept; and on presentation thereof to the city auditor, shall receive a license therefor, stating the article or articles for which it is granted, the room or rooms where to be kept and to whom granted, and shall terminate on the first day of January next succeeding the date of such license. Said license shall be signed by the mayor of the city and countersigned by the city auditor, with the corporate seal of the city attached and shall not be transferable.

Section 3. (Penalty) Any person or persons, firm or corporation violating the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction pay a fine of not more than twenty-five (\$25) dollars and a like sum for each and every day that such billiard table, pool table, pigeon-hole table, bagatelle table or bowling alley is kept without such license.
