

Ordinance No. 33.

An Ordinance Providing for the Licensing of Plumbers. Be it Ordained
by the City Council of Washburn, North Dakota.

Sec. 1. Plumbers Must Have License.

All plumbers or other persons desirous to do work in connection with the city water works, shall furnish the city with a good and sufficient bond in the sum of \$500. to be approved by the city council, to protect, indemnify and save harmless the city of Washburn from any and all loss, claim, suit or damage, direct or consequential, that the said city may sustain by reason of the violation of any rules or regulations that may be in force after having filed said bond; also, as a guarantee of a faithful and proper performance of all work done under said license. The city auditor shall, on receipt of \$10. issue to the said plumber or other person a license permitting him to do work on any and all pipes connecting with the city mains, under and pursuant to all rules and regulations then in force. The city council reserves the right to revoke and annul said license in case of any violation of the rules and regulations governing the management of the city water works. Said bond and license must be renewed each and every year, ending the first Monday in May.

Sec. 2.

This ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication.
