

ORDINANCE NUMBER 40

An ordinance prohibiting children under the age of 18 years from being upon the streets and public places after certain hours, and providing a penalty for violation thereof.

Be it ordained by the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Washburn, McLean County, North Dakota.

Section 1. Children loitering alone after certain hours.

It shall be unlawful for any child or children under the age of 18 years to be walking or loitering about on any of the streets, or frequenting any public place in the City of Washburn, North Dakota, after the hour of ~~eight~~ ^{ten} o'clock in the evening between the first day of October, and the first day of April, each year or after ~~eight~~ ^{ten} o'clock in the evening after April first and until October first each year without being accompanied by parents or guardian.

Section 2. Any child or children found violating the provisions of this Ordinance shall be taken into custody by the City Marshall or other peace officer of the City designated for such purpose and by such officer detained until the following day when such child or children shall be arraigned before the City Magistrate or City Justice of the Peace who may in his discretion commit such child or children to be detained in the common jail of the County not to exceed thirty days.

CITY ORDINANCE
Ordinance Number 40

Be it ordained by the City Commission, of the City of Washburn, North Dakota.

Section 1.—Children loitering alone after certain hours.

It shall be unlawful for any child or children under the age of 18 years to be walking or loitering about on any of the streets, or frequenting any public place in the City of Washburn North Dakota, after the hour of eight (8) o'clock in the evening between the first day of October, and the first day of April, each year or after nine (9) o'clock in the evening after April first and until October first each year without being accompanied by parents or guardian.

Section 2. Any child or children found violating the provisions of this Ordinance shall be taken into custody by the City Marshal or other peace officer of the City designated for such purpose and by such officer detained until the following day when such child or children shall be arraigned before the City Magistrate or the City Justice of the Peace who may in his discretion commit such child or children to be detained in the common jail of the County, not to exceed thirty days.
